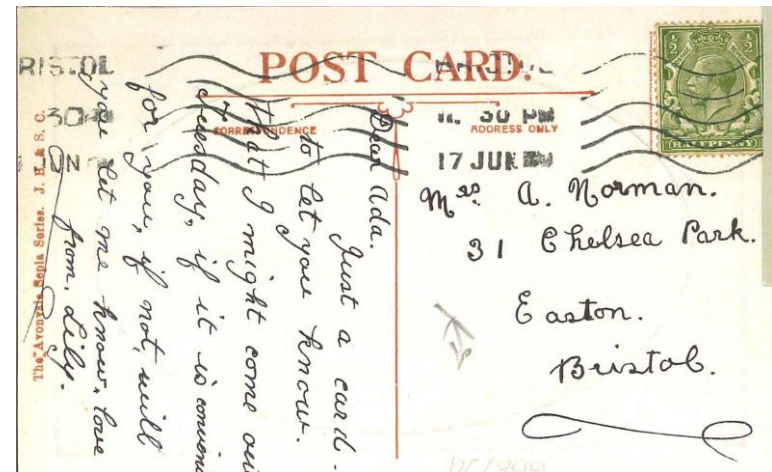
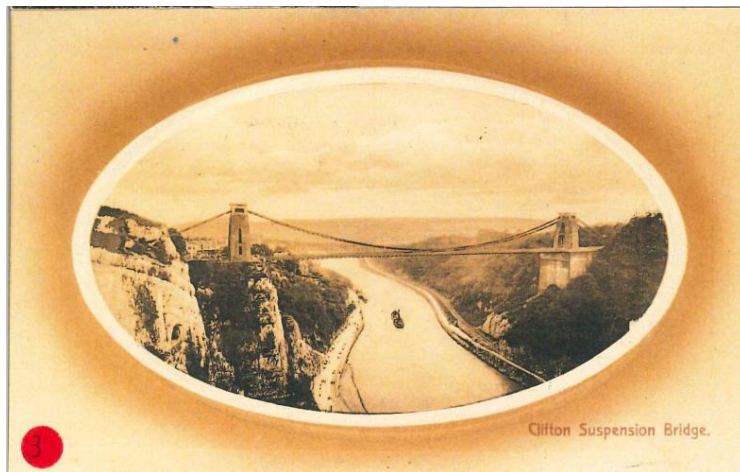


Write a postcard

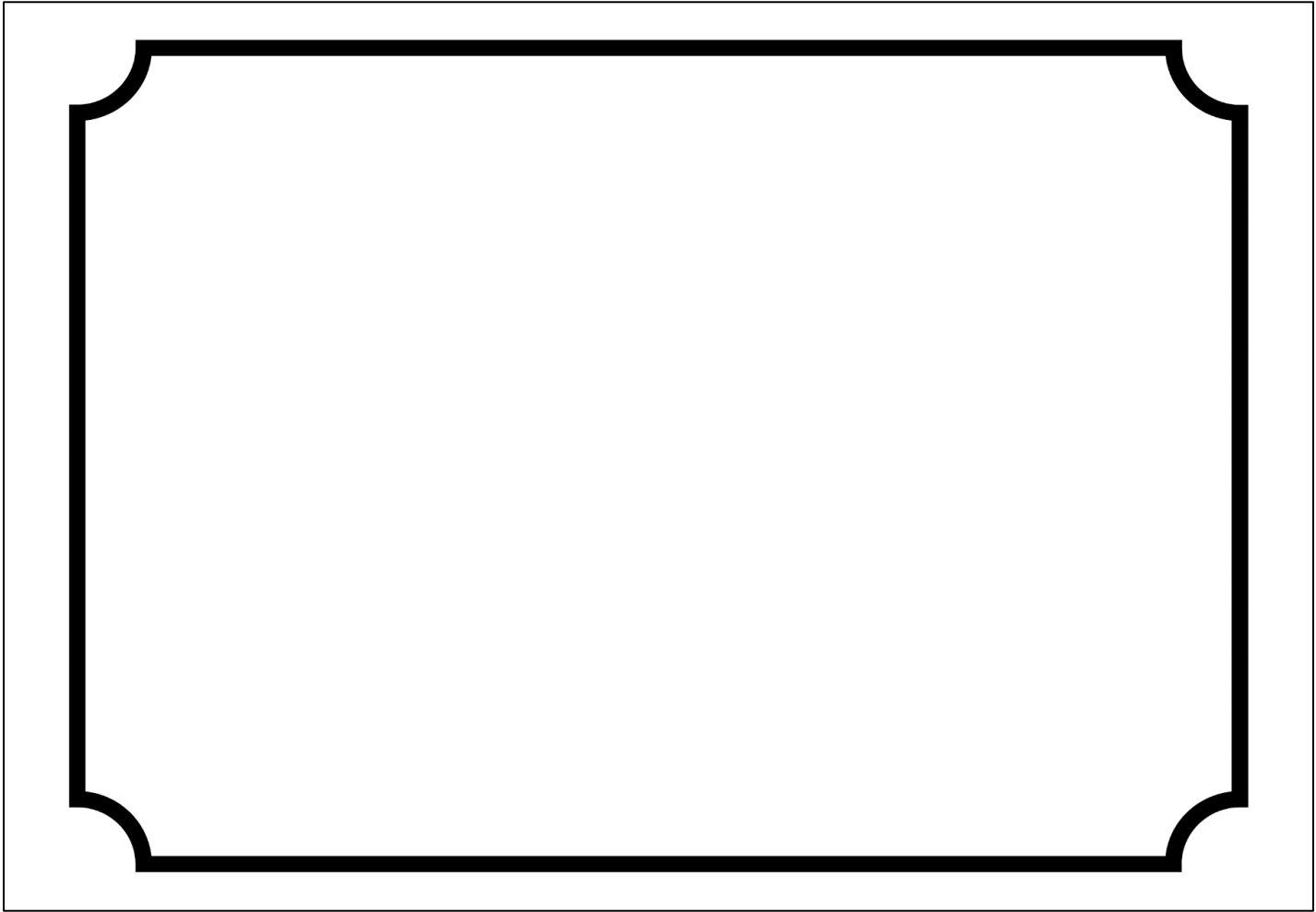


“Dear Ada, Just a card to let you know that I might come out Tuesday, if it is convenient for you, if not, will you let me know. Love from Lily.”
